

Turnout in European elections since 1979: Challenge 51%





QA9 Taking everything into account, would you say that (OUR COUNTRY) has on balance benefited or not from being a member of the EU? (% - EU)






70% of citizens say that the actions of the EU have an impact on their daily life

QA12. Would you say the actions of the EU have an impact on your daily life? (EU27) (%)






73 % expect their personal standard of living to further decrease in 2024 (-6 p compared to March 2023)




57% of citizens are interested in the coming European elections – plus 6 points compared to 2018

Increased measured in 25 Member States – in Belgium 52% say they are interested, a plus of 9 points



Two out of three would (very likely) go to vote – a plus of 9 points compared to 2018

Largest increases in Poland (+23), Slovakia (+20), Romania (+20), Portugal and Greece (je +19)




