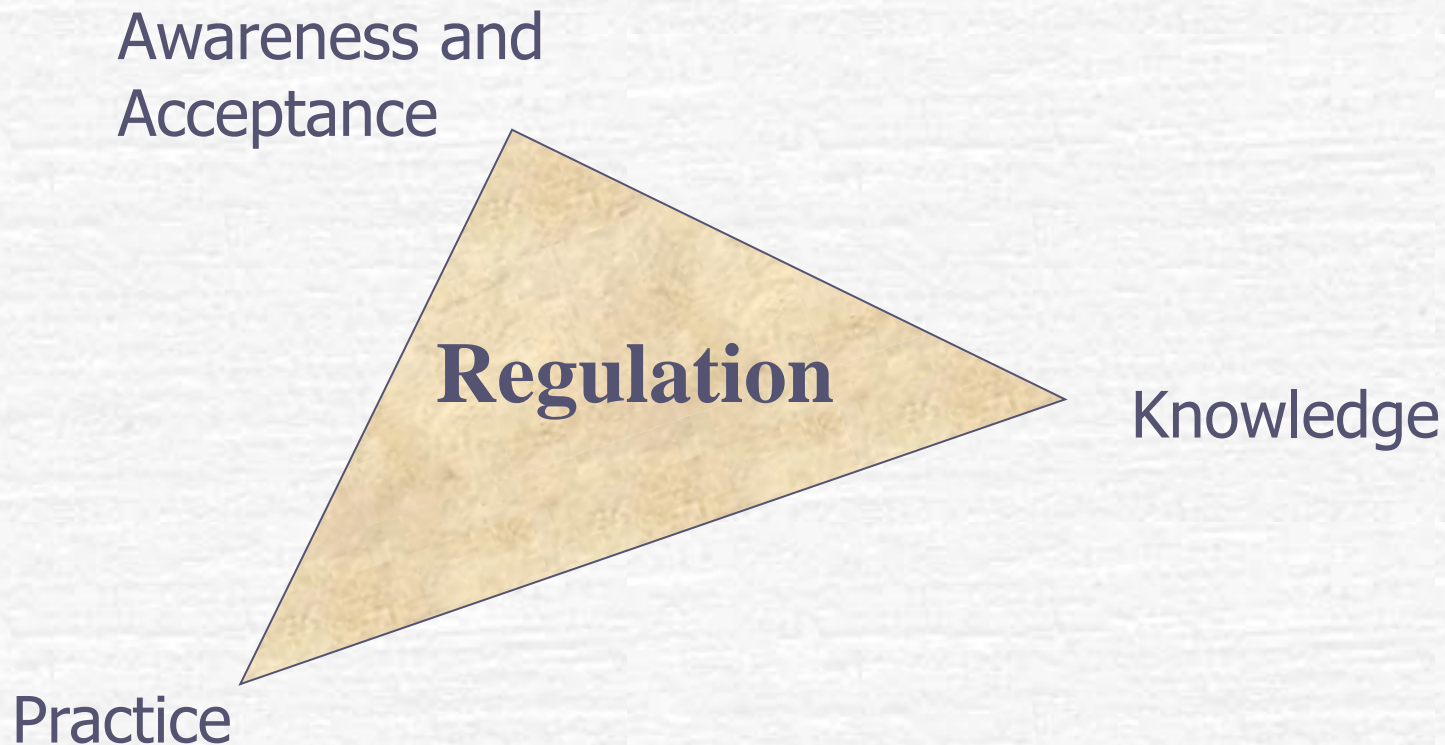

# EPB-Directive

- The Directive was revised in 2018 (EU 2018/844)
- The overall goal: “The Union is committed to developing a sustainable, competitive, secure and decarbonised energy system. The Energy Union and the Energy and Climate Policy Framework for 2030 establish ambitious Union commitments to reduce greenhouse gas emissions further by at least 40 % by 2030 as compared with 1990.”

# Social Partner Project: VET4LEC

- European Social Partner project for the construction Industry
- Point of departure:

“Approaches to VET for LEC vary considerably, though countries face similar challenges and all need to ensure that VET is effective for meeting NZEB requirements, incorporates LEC-related KSC, and is sufficiently broad to cover transversal abilities and cross-occupational understanding.”
