



A stronger ECDC mandate & a new regulation on serious cross-border health threats – what does this entail?

Improving epidemiological surveillance	 Digitalisation of integrated surveillance systems enabling real-time surveillance Support MS with integrated surveillance systems, further develop digital platforms EI is carried out more effective – using IT such as AI
Foresight, modelling and research priority setting	 Modelling, anticipation and scenario development for response Contribute to research priorities and actions funded by EU instruments
Better preparedness and response in MS	 Develop prevention and response plans & elaborate assessment framework Non-binding recommendations for risk management
EU Health Task Force	 Expanded capacity to mobilise and deploy the EU HTF providing: Effective and timely operational response & preparedness support, contributing to global health security & strengthening countries emergency preparedness
Health systems capacity	 Monitor and assess health systems capacity for diagnosis, prevention and treatment Network of EU reference laboratories and SOHO Expanding work on prevention (e.g. AMR, vaccination and biosecurity)
Expand international role	 Contribution to EU's international cooperation & commitment to global health security preparedness Intensify collaboration with international partners (WHO), ENP countries, other CDCs


