# Global Situation Current Agrifood Systems

#### 2023 Theme

Agrifood systems transformation accelerates climate action



735 million people still face hunger



80% of biodiversity loss on land and deforestation



1/3 of food lost or wasted



1/3 of anthropogenic greenhouse gas emissions



Hidden cost: \$12- \$17 trillion/year (20% - environmental costs linked to deforestation and land use)



Up to 70% of freshwater usage

### Youth Policy Board

A group of young people appointed through a selective process, that governs the Youth Assembly, provide neutral standpoints to draft policy statements and positions based on the outcomes of **WFF Youth Assembly.**

Network of young scientists to provide scientific knowledge and evidence to the initiatives of the WFF, and produce bi-annual report on the issues surrounding agrifood systems.


# Global Network of youth partners

#### INNOVATION

Provide youth with the necessary knowledge, skills and confidence to get into the workforce and actively shape agrifood systems in consideration of human and planetary health.

#### **School Assembly**

Educational pilot focusing on primary and secondary schools and their agrifood knowledge needs at an early age

#### **Youth Skills Hub**

Online platform with tools, e-learning courses, career opportunities and networking platforms to boost youth interest and capacity in the agrifood sector


