

EU Green Deal -Transforming our economy, jobs and way of life

- Paris Agreement limiting global warming to preferably 1.5°C
- EU Green Deal climate neutrality by 2050 with an ambitious action plan
- EU climate law sets a target of achieving at least 55% greenhouse gas emission reduction
- No significant impact at macro level (as for GDP) but significant impact in some sectors and regions
- 25 million workers in industrial sectors face changes
- Preparation of 2040 climate target → must set target in line with Climate neutrality by 2050 (in reality that would mean -90-95%).
- This is happening in a context of a triple crisis (energy prices, cost of living, but also climate)

The prospects for a Just Transition are strongest where social dialogue and collective bargaining work well....

7 regional roundtables on trade union involvement and state of play of social dialogue and collective bargaining systems

Some conclusions:

- Different preparedness in different regions, in terms of economic strength, industrial infrastructure, energy infrastructure
- Fragmentation of collective bargaining systems and TU strength,
- dependency on MNCs and in CEE, South & Western Balkans/impacts on supply chain,
- In some countries lack of national long-term strategies and industrial strategies,
- Everywhere: skills shortages might be a real bottleneck
- Energy price crisis impacts debate in all regions, with regional differences
