In a nutshell

- Standards setting organization, formally 'recognized by the EU'
- ICT and « ICT inside » e.g. 5G, IoT/M2M, intelligent transport, (cyber)security, e-ID, etc
- Collaborative working and partnerships, esp. 3GPP and oneM2M
- Global membership (900 members, 65 countries), direct participation
- 'All you can eat' and free availability of deliverables
- Focus on Interoperability (CTI)

A brainchild of Europe > EC and EFTA are Counsellors of ETSI

Standards in support of EU policies and legislation

Contributes to ICT radio frequency requirements to the EU co-ordination process



Global membership. global footprint of standards implementation (incl. HENs)

Operates in partnership with peers worldwide (US, China, Japan, Korea, India)

- 3SI aims at increasing the actual participation of societal stakeholders and SMEs to ETSI work
- Builds on the formal role the “Annex III organisations” have in Regulation 2012/1025
- Boardroom topic



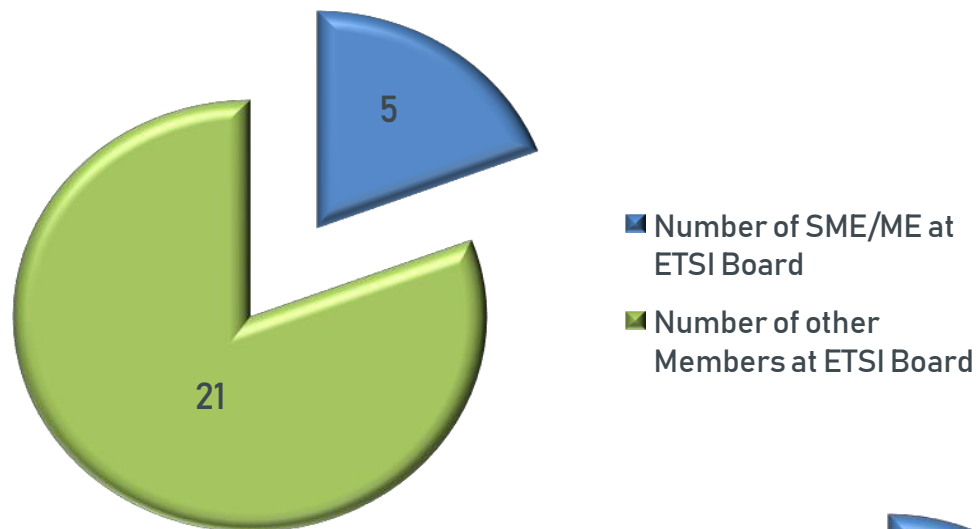
A goal keeper

Advocate appointed by the Board

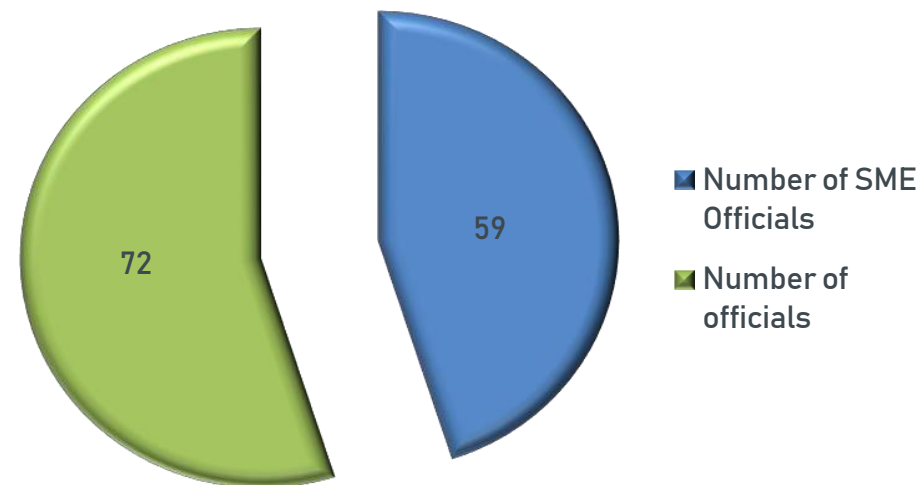
- Point of call for all Members

- Proposes further improvements concerning inclusiveness.



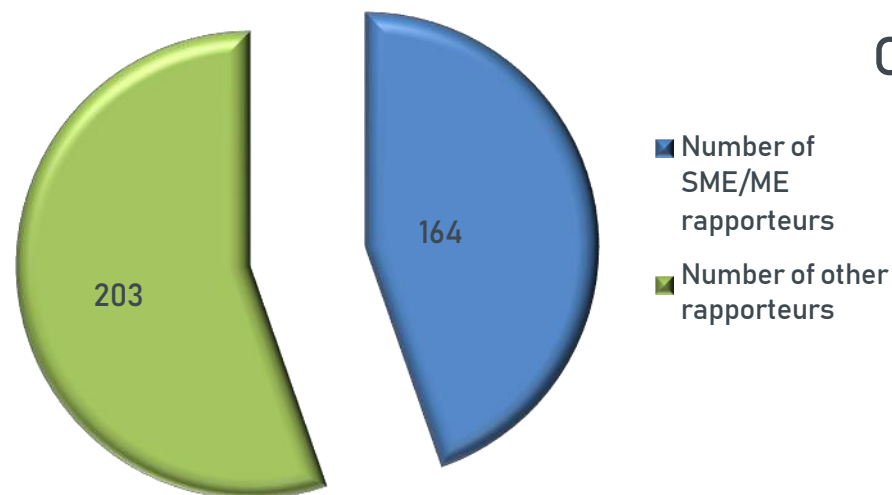
Focus: the real influence of SMEs

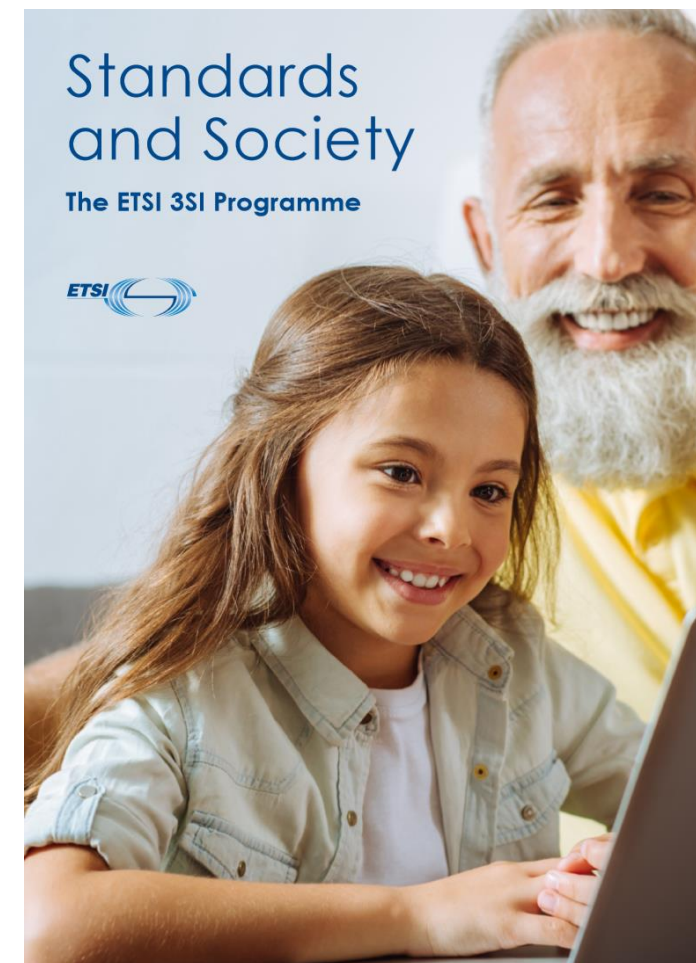

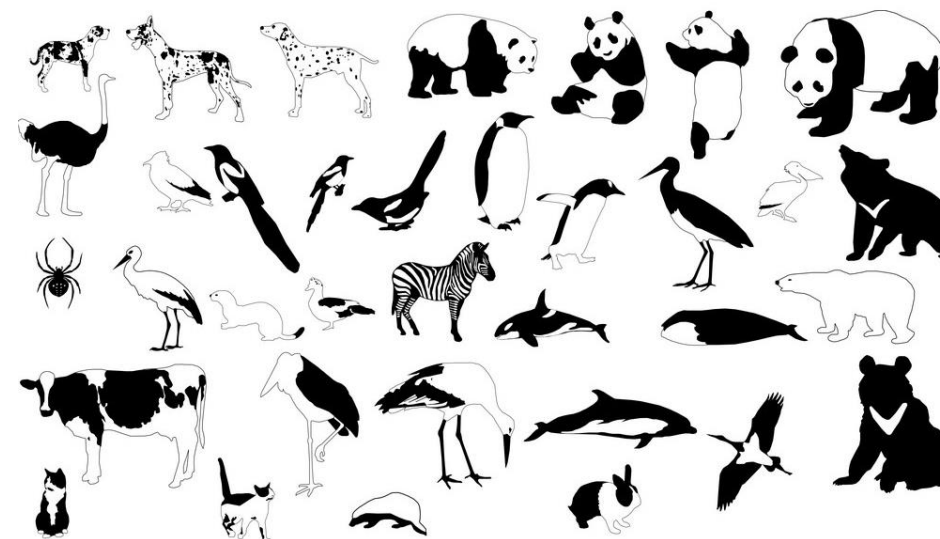
Diversifying the ecosystem (LTS)
