



# Role of EU gas market

- IOGP supports the development of a well-interconnected, efficient and liquid EU gas market
  - Liquid gas hubs provide flexibility and security
- We see a continuing importance for the EU gas system in the long-term
  - Natural gas to hydrogen conversion, with CCS
  - Renewable gases
  - New technologies show potential decarbonised role of gas infrastructure, such as pipelines, gas storage, gas transmission & distribution networks
- Around half EU gas supply comes from European production
  - Challenge is how to promote new E&P investment in Europe (5,156bcm gas resources remain in Europe)





### Gas Directive amendment

- Important to recognise distinction between upstream pipelines and transmission interconnectors
  - This proposal mainly covers transmission interconnectors
  - The regime applying to upstream pipelines remains unchanged
  - Avoid new and undefined terms such as 'import infrastructure', 'import pipeline', etc
- What does "first interconnection point with the Union network" imply?
  - DG Energy: should be understood as physical interconnection point
  - Intention is not to refer to offshore virtual points
- Future gas market proposals should be subject to impact assessment and stakeholder consultation
  - Important to avoid unintended consequences
