Interreg Europe rationale

Supports the identification and transfer of **good practices** among 'regions' in order to improve regional development policies

Helps policymakers to find new solutions to their challenges

- Primarily dedicated to public authorities
- Focus on exchange of experience

 Lifelong education and improving the skills and competitiveness of exiting construction workers in the energy efficiency field in Croatia.



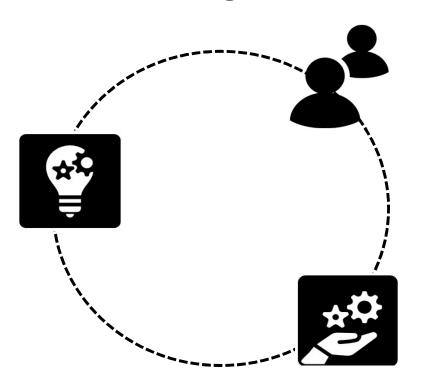

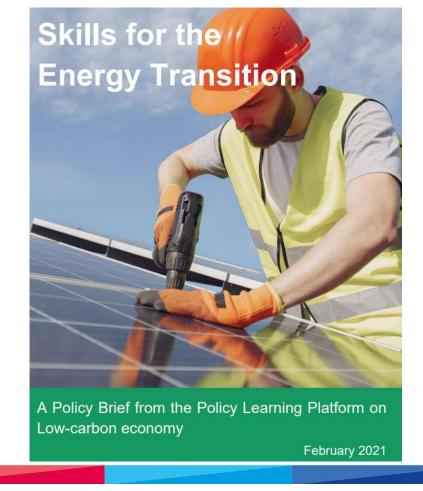

- Presents solutions for raising awareness and providing initial advice on energy efficiency.

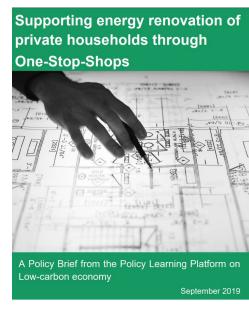

EXPERTISE: Peer review example

Energy Efficiency: skills and programmes for SMEs



Region of Western Macedonia, Greece

Peers from: Cyprus, Malta, Croatia and Greece

Recommendations:

- Promotion of a dedicated energy agency, following the example of the **Energy Savings Agency**, established by the Region of Upper **Austria** in 1991.
- Training and qualification of workers operating in the energy-efficiency related construction sector. This could be established by implementing specialised certification projects, like WE QUALIFY project in Cyprus.
- Development of special entities providing support to building-owners with regards to energy renovation works. Such a special entity is the One Stop Shop in Bordeaux Metropole Ma Rénov in France.
