1. Who is responsible for the processing of your personal data?

This online event is organised by the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC) and the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) who are the joint data controllers in charge of the processing of your personal data. The EESC is in charge of the event website, the registration process, the promotion of the event via email invitations, part of the event programme and contacts with the speakers, and all technical aspects allowing the event to be held onsite. SDSN is in charge of part of the event programme and contacts with the speakers.

The services responsible for processing your personal data on behalf of the joint controllers are the Section for Agriculture, Rural Development and the Environment (NAT) of the EESC (nat-events@eesc.europa.eu) and SDSN (info@unsdsn.org).

2. What is the purpose of the processing?

Your personal data will be processed in order to:

- register you for the workshop: *How to strengthen EU's leadership on the SDGs - Civil society's and experts' contributions for the UN HLPF and beyond*
- send you monthly updates (EESC NAT newsletter) about upcoming events, opinions and news in the field of Sustainable Development, Climate Action & Agriculture (**with your consent only**);
- send you monthly updates about the work at SDSN (**with your consent only**).

The EESC is not responsible for recordings (such as photographs or videos) made by participants in a private capacity.

3. What is the legal basis for the processing?

[Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) applies to the processing of your personal data collected for the organisation and management of this online event. The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 5(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, as the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in a Union institution or body. The EESC exercises its tasks as set out in Articles 300-304 of the [Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union](#).

[Regulation \(EU\) 2016/679 \(General Data Protection Regulation\)](#) applies to the processing of your personal data collected for the organisation and management of this event by SDSN. The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 6(e) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679, as the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

The processing of certain categories of your personal data as described in this privacy statement will be carried out based on your consent (Article 5(d) of [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#)) in the case of the EESC and Article 6(a) of [Regulation \(EU\) 2016/679](#) in the case of the SDSN.

4. What personal data are processed?

The following personal data will be processed:

- information necessary for your registration: title, first name, last name, nationality, ID/ Passport No, e-mail, name of organisation

Your consent is required for:

- photos, audio and video recordings and web streaming related to the workshop: *How to strengthen EU's leadership on the SDGs - Civil society's and experts' contributions for the UN HLPF and beyond* invitations to future events the EESC may organise;
- the sending of information about future EESC NAT activities;
- the sending of information about future SDSN activities.

You can provide your consent via the online event registration form.

5. Who are the recipients or categories of recipients of your personal data?

The recipients of your data will be the EESC and SDSN staff in charge of the organisation, management and follow-up of this event.

Under certain conditions defined in law, we may disclose your information to third parties (such as the European Anti-Fraud Office, the Court of Auditors or law enforcement authorities) if it is necessary and proportionate for lawful, specific purposes.

We will never share your personal data for direct marketing purposes.

Photographs and/or audio and video recordings could be published in the context of the workshop: *How to strengthen EU's leadership on the SDGs - Civil society's and experts' contributions for the UN HLPF and beyond* and in the framework of EESC activities on the web, including via social media. If need be, the files containing the video materials may be slightly altered (for example, brightness and contrast) so that they can be used for the purposes for which they were taken.

6. Are your personal data transferred to a third country (non-EU Member State) or international organisation?

Your personal data will not be transferred to a non-EU member state and/or international organisation.

7. How can you exercise your rights?

You have the right to request access to your personal data. You also have the right to request rectification or erasure or restriction of the processing of your personal data. You also have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Please note that withdrawal of consent will not have retroactive effect (processing of your personal data based on your consent before withdrawal is lawful up to the moment when you withdraw your consent).

Where applicable, you have the right to object to the processing of your data. Where applicable, you have the right to receive your personal data provided to the controller or to have your personal data transmitted directly to another controller (data portability).

You can direct your queries to nat-events@eesc.europa.eu and info@unsdsn.org. The query will be dealt with within 22 working days.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the European Data Protection Supervisor (edps@edps.europa.eu) if you consider that your rights under Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data by the EESC.

If you consider that your rights under Regulation (EU) 2016/679 have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data by SDSN, you can lodge a complaint with the Commission nationale de l'informatique et des libertés (CNIL) (<https://www.cnil.fr/fr>).

8. How long are your personal data kept for?

Your data (excluding photos, audio and video recordings that have been published and personal data provided for accreditation purposes) will be kept for a maximum period of 12 months after the end of the event, unless you explicitly agree to your contact details being kept in order to receive invitations to future similar events organised by the EESC and/or SDSN.

If you wish to delete these data at any time after you have given your consent, please contact us at nat-events@eesc.europa.eu and info@unsdsn.org and we will do so within 30 working days upon receipt of your request or after the latest correspondence with you about your request.

Your photos, audio and video recordings that have been published (for example on the web or in publications) will remain in that format indefinitely.

9. Are your personal data transferred to a third country (non-EU Member State) or international organisation?

Your personal data will not be transferred to a non-EU member state and/or international organisation.

10. Are personal data collected used for automated decision-making, including profiling?

The EESC will not use your personal data to make automated decisions about you. "Automated decisions" are defined as decisions made without human intervention. You have the right to opt out of automated processing at any time and to require that decisions be assessed by a person.

11. Will your personal data be further processed for a purpose other than that for which the data were obtained?

Your personal data will not be further processed for a different purpose than the ones mentioned above.
