Community-led action

Local community-led action takes different forms

- 1,200 transition town initiatives in 48 countries
- 15,000 ecovillages on 6 continents- not on Antarctica!
- 3 million permaculture practitioners in 140 countries

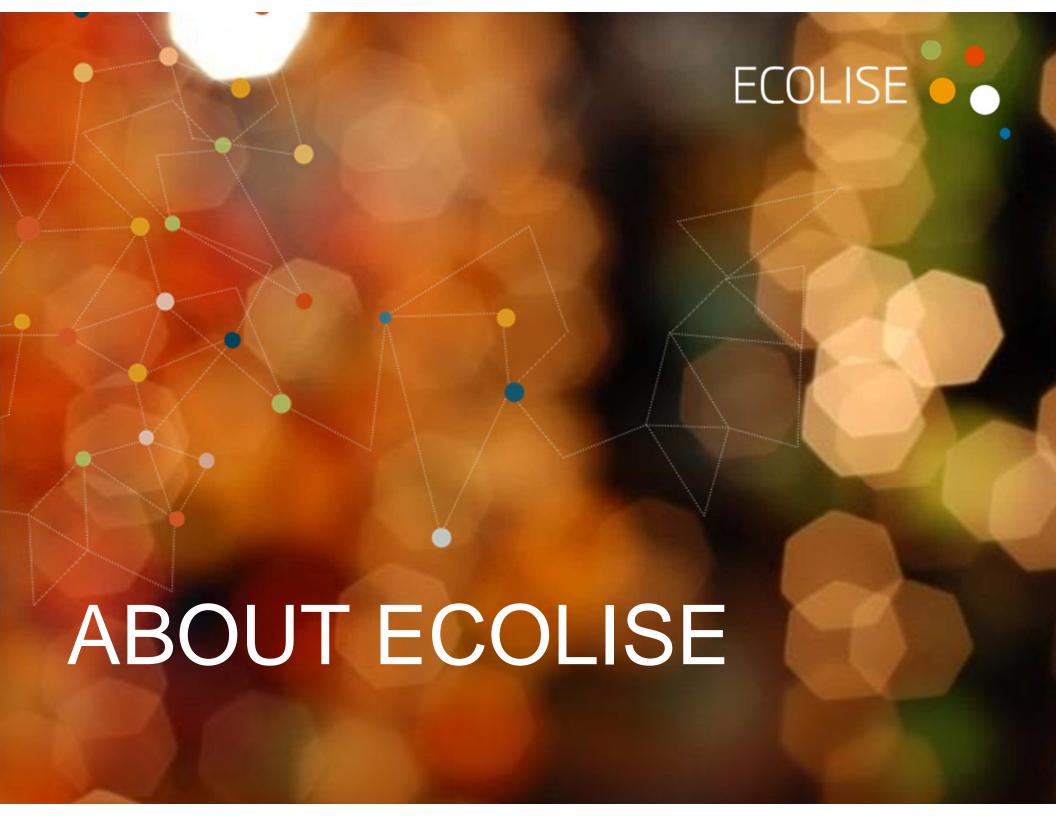


Community-led action



An independent EU-funded study (TESS) of ecovillages concluded that if only 5% of citizens were involved in effective community-led climate mitigation initiatives the EU's 2020 carbon emissions targets would be 85% achieved.

In these communities virtually 100 % of SDG targets were already reached.

European Day for Sustainable Communities

The first-ever European Day was held on 23 September 2017.

The Day was preceded on 22nd September by an event cohosted by EESC and ECOLISE, including for the first time LIVE inputs online from ECOLISE event organisers around Europe.

Citizens in 15 EU countries showcased their pioneering efforts to create new models for sustainable living.

ECOLISE aims to continue this celebration annually, inviting other partners to become involved and further develop the event. It seeks the political and financial support from the EU Estonian Presidency, EC, EP, EESC and others.

The concept was shared at COP 23 in 3 events: an EESC Side event; a CAN dialogue with the European Parliamentarians; and a Global Ecovillage Network Press Conference

European Day for Sustainable Communities

- 6 KEY MESSAGES that ECOLISE wishes to pass at this event today:
- 1. There is a Significant vacuum between Climate Change political rhetoric and delivery of lasting, high quality benefits for local communities. Communities are not listened to!
- 2. Participation, 'ownership' by local communities is critical for success. Politicians by-pass communities at their peril.
- 3. Without ANY serious support or recognition, local communities have nevertheless shown by example, true leadership on climate change issues.
- 4. A radical re-think is needed to involve communities at all levels. The Business as Usual Approach is doomed.
- 5. The designation of a European and International Day to celebrate and honour local communities' involvement would be a worthy step which the EESC, EP, EC should support.
- 6. Out of the box thinking needed: create a Community index (like the EIA methodology) to measure community buy-in?
