General position

- CEI-Bois condemns illegal logging
 - Damages promotion of legal and sustainable forest practices
 - Damages the image of wood as an environmentally positive material
- CEI-Bois supports EU in fighting it
- Active involvement in decision-making process
- Basic support to Commission proposals

But...

- Need for rationalism in the debate
 - No emotions or beliefs
 - Reliable facts and figures
- Majority of wood and timber products in EU are derived from sustainable managed European forests





Concerns over EP proposals

- "Placing on the market"
 - Due diligence to apply to 1st placing on the market only
 - Avoid burden of proof on all operators in the value chain
- Legality vs. Sustainability are two different notions not to be mixed up
- "Applicable legislation"

CEI-Bois Roadmap 2010

 Applying regional or international legislation not always possible



Concerns over EP proposals


- "Risk assessment"
 - Trade associations to be allowed to play a role
- "Labelling requirement"
 - Not applicable in practice
 - Any product on the market should deemed to be legal
- Economic impact on the wood sector (majority SME!)
