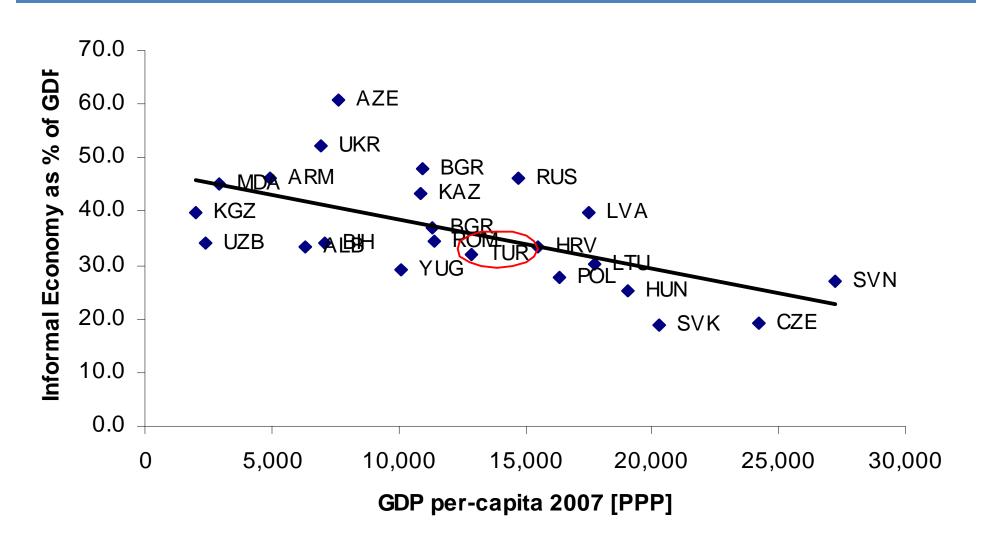

## Why informality should be reduced

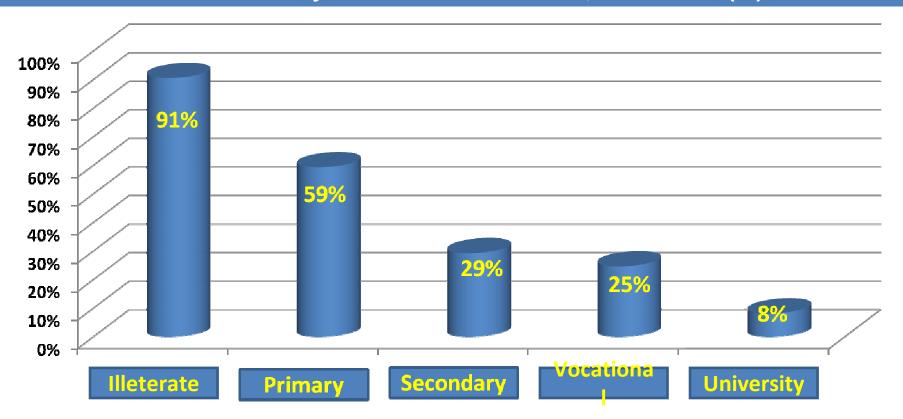
- For Companies
  - to abolish the dichotomy in the economy
  - to prevent unfair competition
  - to increase productivity, institutionalisation, better access to finance
- For Employees
  - Social Security access to the health services and the retirement benefits
  - Unionization Union rights
  - More productivity More income
- For Public Administration
  - Broader tax base
  - Less tax distortion



#### Informality;

- is strongly determined by the level of education
- decreases as the level of schooling increases

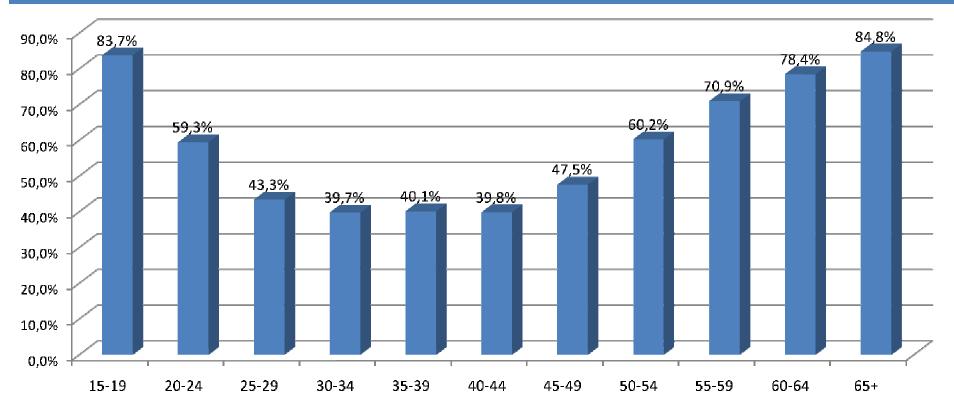

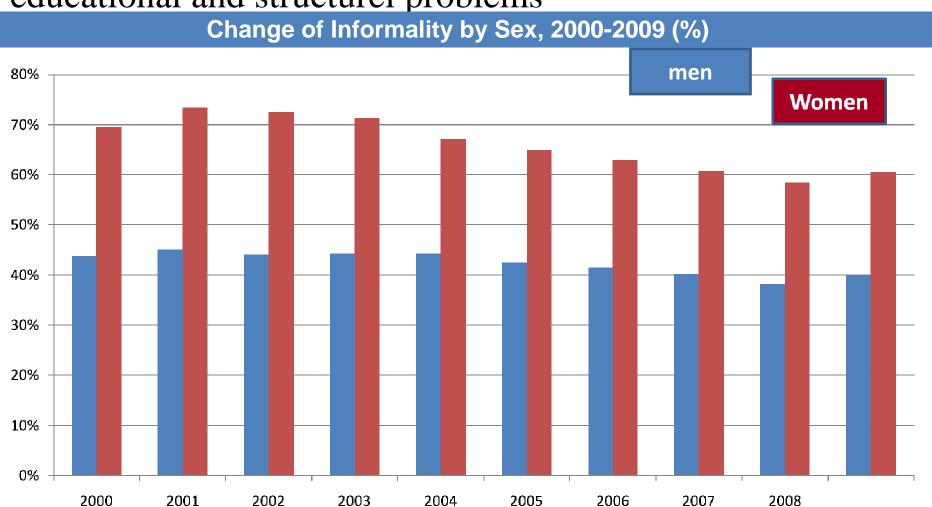
Informal employment is pervasively widespread among the young and those over middle-age. Data shows that the informality is more common among the young and retired.

Incidence of Informality by age groups, 2000-2006 (%)





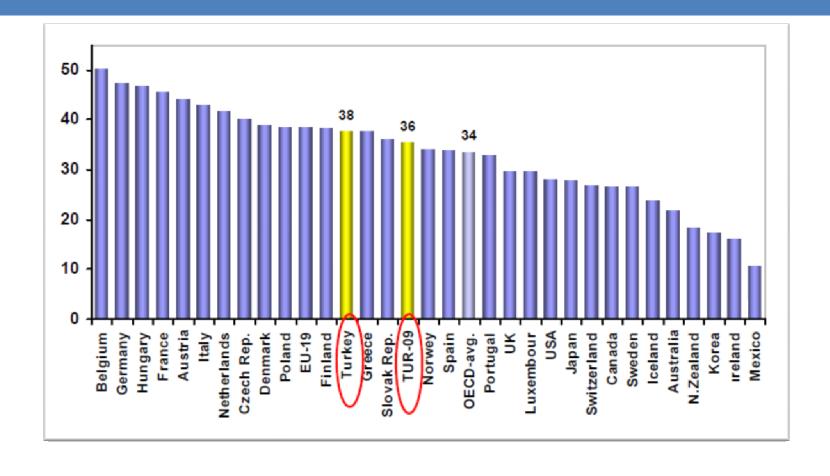
Deepening informality among women, due to some educational and structurel problems



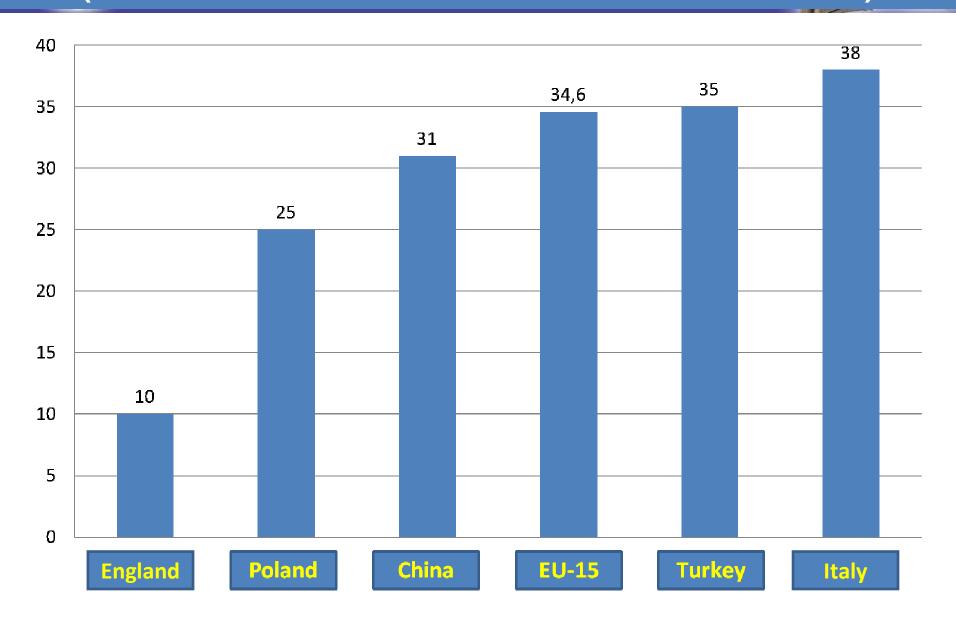




## Tax Wedges on Labour (married with two children) OECD Countries, 2009

## Dichotomy (dual economy) is a major problem in Turkish economy

#### Formal Economy – Modern segment

- The average labour productivity is 62% of the US total
- Economies of scale, better access to capital and export markets

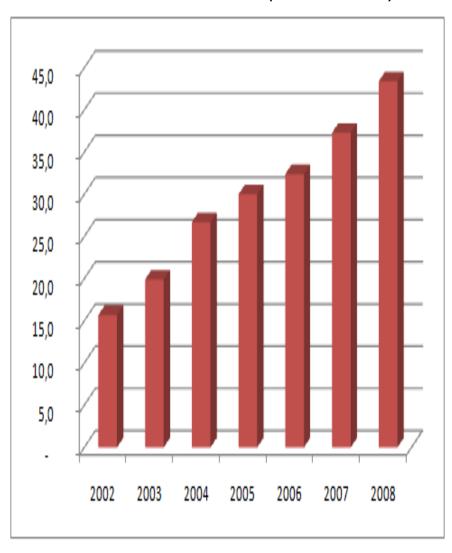
#### Informal Economy – Traditional segment

- They achieve productivity levels of only 25% of the US.
- Operates with low tech., little standardization, lower quality

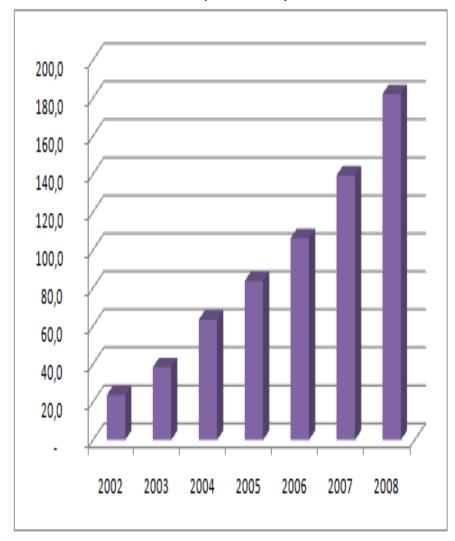




## Credit Card Transaction Domestic Transaction Volume (billion TL.)

### **Number Of Compulsory Insured Person**

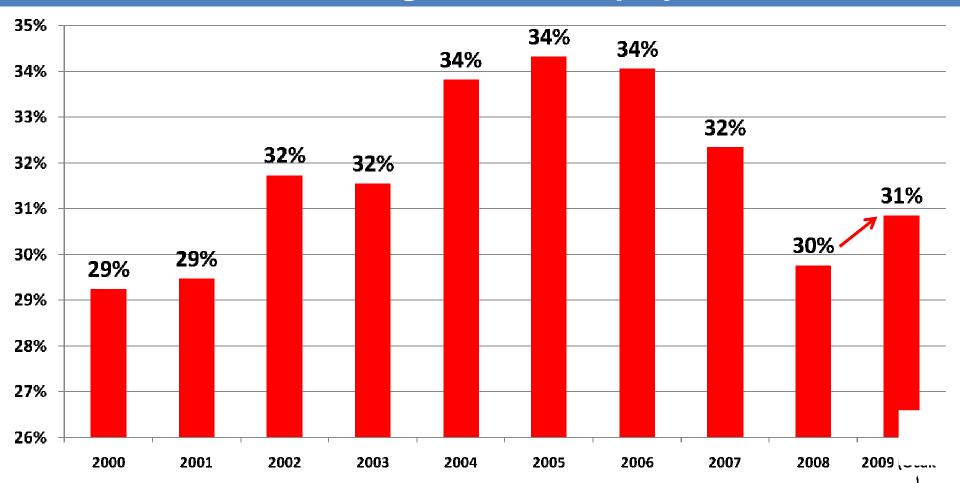

#### What Makes this Financial Crisis different from others?

- the global nature of the current crisis has been unprecedented
- the economic policy responses and the magnitude of its impact are not comparable with those of previous crises
- Deeper & Long-Lasting
- Different kind of Creative Destruction (more destructive but less creative)

# Informal Employment and the Economic Crisis What are the lessons for the current episode?

- Preserve the Production capacity
- Introduce Fair-Competition policies
  - Active Labour Market Policies to increase labour productvity
  - Industrial Policy
  - Expanding access to finance
  - Improving Business and Investment Climate

#### A New Framework (1)

- Abolish Rigid Labor Markets Towards a Flexible Labour Market
  - protect the worker, not the work
- Carrot-and-Stick approach in coordination
  - Emphasis the carrot
    - Reduce the burden of taxation and regulation
  - Keep hold of the Stick
    - Better and Efficient Tax Supervision
    - Targeting firms that are using informality to gain a competitive edge

#### A New Framework (2)

- Increasing Productivity
  - skills development to prevent skill atrophy
  - İnstitutionalisation of SME's
