From June 2005 EMSA has inspected:

- 21 non-EU Countries
- 15 Member States
- 48 MET institutions in non-EU Countries
- 52 MET institutions in Member States

EMSA task - Inspections

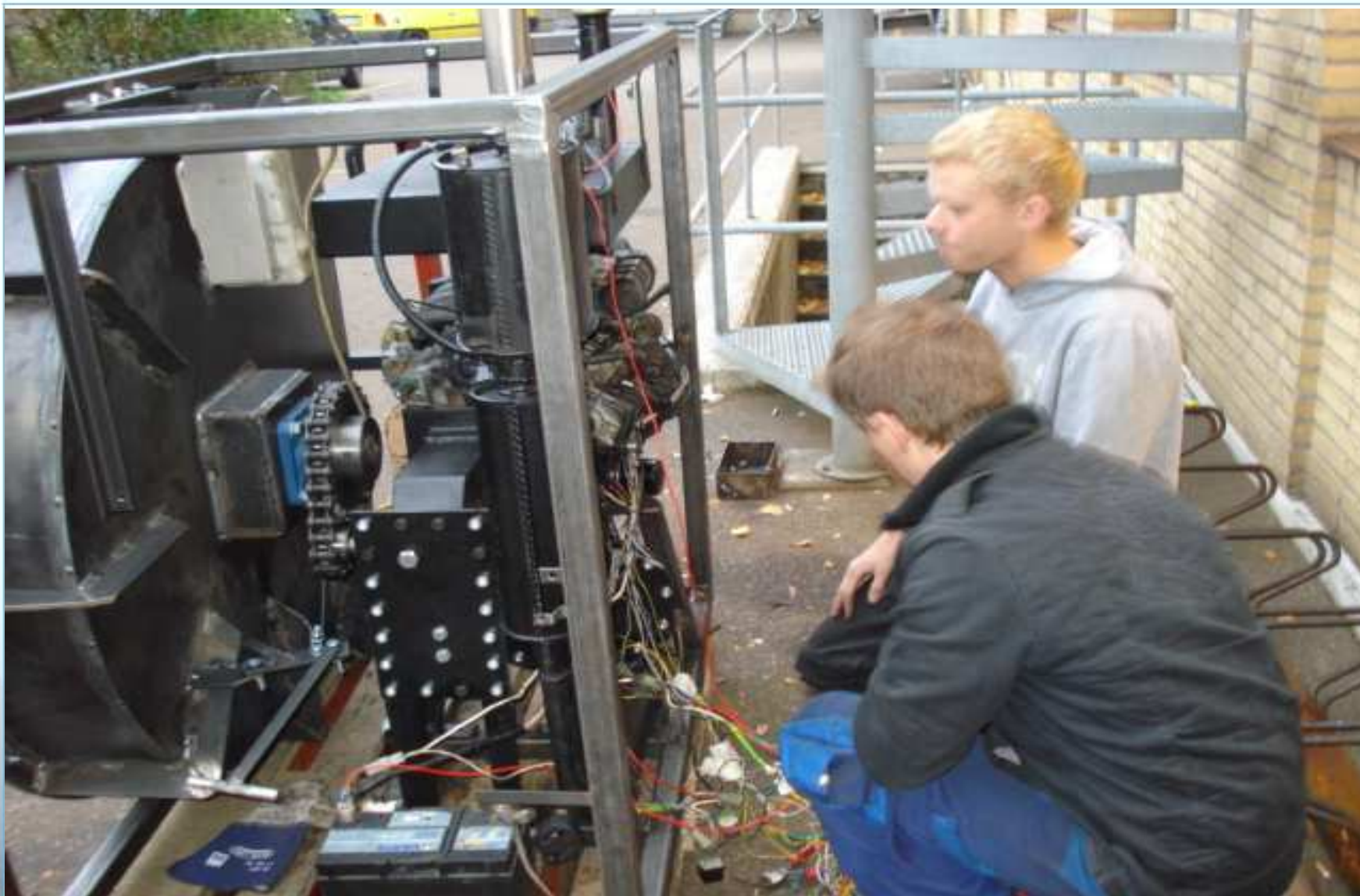
The methodology requires:

- Gathering of Data on Students and Programmes













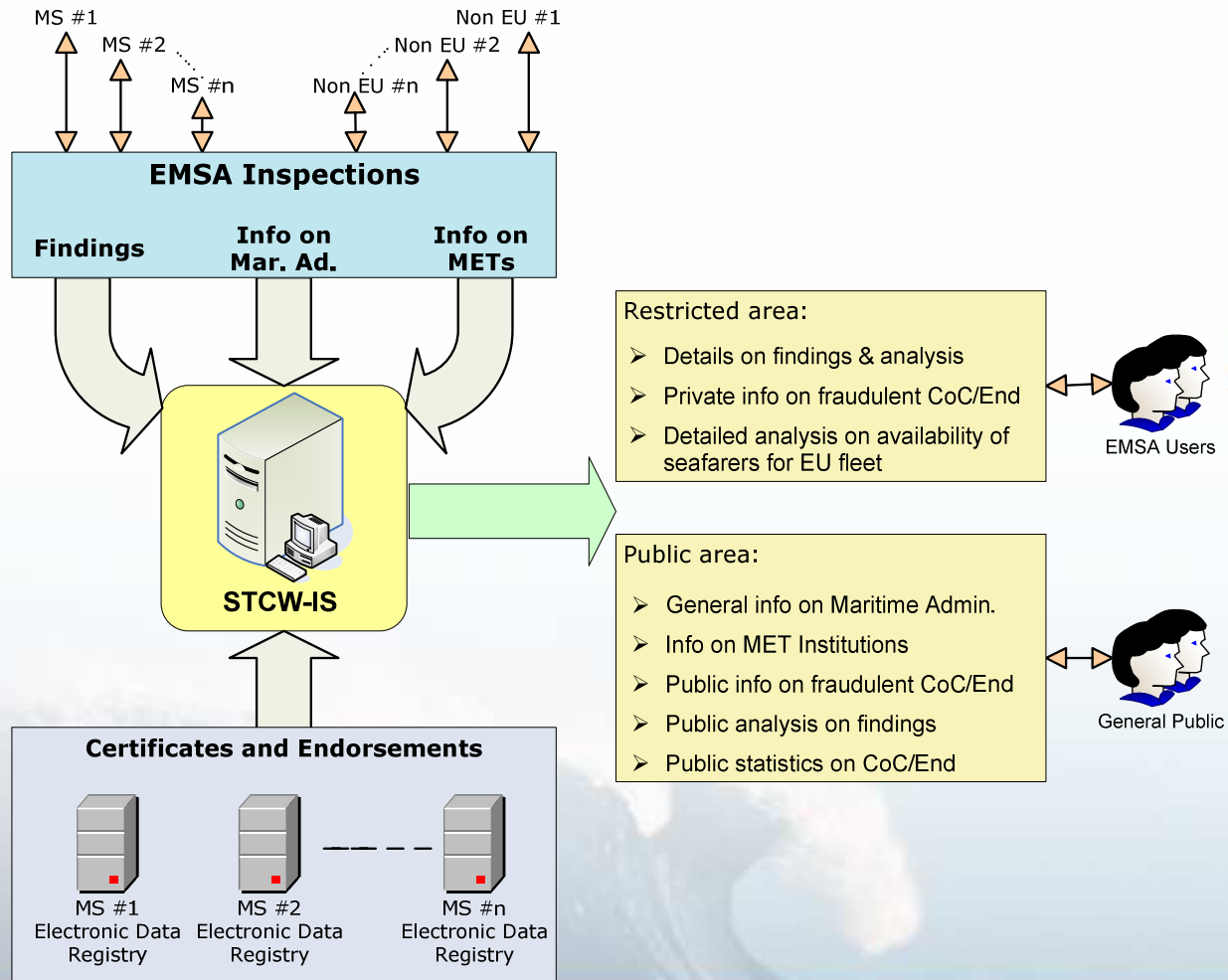




EMSA task – the STCW-IS
